Willoughby has many stunning public open spaces to enjoy in summer, including native bushland, tidal baths, parklands and reserves. Our new COVID-Safe Summer Plan will keep our spaces open and our community safe as NSW re-opens for the 2021-22 summer holiday season.

2021/2022

This plan will support Council in managing open public spaces effectively in response to NSW Public Health Orders and recommendations. It is underpinned by internal COVID-Safe Summer Plan procedures. The plan applies to open public spaces that are at risk of large gatherings and crowds during the summer months, including:

- Harbour Baths
- Parks
- BBQ areas
- Picnic tables, shelter sheds and outdoor seating areas
- Playground and exercise stations
- Skate parks.

These **locations of interest** will be regularly patrolled by Rangers from 1 December 2021 to 28 February 2022:

- Northbridge Baths
- Clive Park

What you can do to keep COVID-Safe this summer

- Practice good hand hygiene
- If unwell, stay at home and get tested
- Maintain 1.5m physical distance from others
- When visiting Northbridge Baths keep a towel length between you and other beachgoers
- Wear a mask in crowded areas
- Check Council's website, social media channels and signage at parks and open spaces for the latest information.

- Install new, visible signage at parks and open spaces
