In particular about the changes and significant reductions to building height and FSR limits near the southern end of the CBD. , have been in discussions We along with the other 20 owners of the apartment block on with developers to jointly re-develop our entire building. The current building has not been renovated for years and really needs a refresh. However, the council's reductions are likely to mean that existing buildings will remain in the long-term future as it isn't financially worthwhile to redevelop them at all. I acknowledge that council wants to reduce the impact of new buildings on the houses in the heritage area, however many buildings on Johnson Street are already 8-10 storeys and the latest Chatswood CBD Strategy shows 7-12 storeys buildings. It was exciting that council originally wanted to redevelop this area which includes mostly older and unattractive buildings. It is very disappointing that council has decided to implement a plan that will probably result in no new buildings and the area will remain unchanged into the long term future.
