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# **Background & Methodology**

### Objectives (Why?)

- Update the first wave conducted in 2019, in terms of:
  - Assessing the community's level of agreement with statements regarding social wellbeing and connectedness
  - o Identifying the community's sense of personal wellbeing and housing and financial security
  - Identifying access issues to local services
  - o Identifying the community's overall satisfaction and quality of life and understanding the key drivers of quality of life.

### Sample (How?)


- Telephone survey (landline and mobile) to N = 671 residents. N = 20 Multi-lingual surveys (Mandarin and Cantonese)
- N=92 recruited via Micromex Community Panel. N=11 acquired through number harvesting (due to COVID restrictions no new number harvesting was conducted in 2021, though previously collected numbers were utilised)
- Greatest margin of error +/- 3.8%









#### Identify as having a disability or long term illness?

### Overview

- Overall, 2021 results for most of the community wellbeing metrics are very similar to the inaugural 2019 wave. Given the impacts of COVID that have occurred since the 2019 wave, this is an encouraging result.
- Furthermore, where we have normative data (e.g.: quality of life, culture and diversity, safety and work and employment), Willoughby City Council tends to score above those benchmarks. Willoughby scored on par with the benchmark measures for connection (see Slides 9 and 13). Willoughby did not score below any norms
- Some of the differences in 2021 results versus 2019 perhaps stemming from the COVID situation may present opportunities for Council:
  - Outwardly, the community seems resilient, perhaps reflecting a pride in coping during COVID for instance:
    - The only one of 12 agree/disagree statements about the local area/neighbourhood to increase significantly from 2019 was 'My local community copes well when faced with challenges' (albeit it has the lowest overall score of all 12 attributes)
    - Similarly, the highest of seven 'personal wellbeing' agreement statements was 'I feel like I can adapt to change well' scores for this attribute have remained steady since 2019 against the backdrop of COVID. And this attribute has increased in its importance as a driver of overall quality of life.
  - However, there have been some significant declines in 2021 on several key sense-of-self/connectedness metrics:
    - Of 15 quality-of-life satisfaction questions, the only one to drop significantly was 'Your mental health' and this attribute has increased in its importance as a driver of overall quality of life.
    - Of seven 'personal wellbeing' agreement statements, the two that dropped significantly in 2021 were 'I generally do not feel lonely' and 'I generally do not feel anxious', indicating that residents <u>do</u> tend to feel <u>more</u> lonely and anxious in 2021.
    - There has been a slight (not significant) dip in the frequency of feeling positive emotions and a significant increase in the frequency of feeling negative emotions.
    - 26% of residents want more connection/engagement with their local area than they currently have up slightly on 22% in 2019

Council can potentially support the community by recognizing that on the one hand residents are outwardly proud of their resilience (perhaps due in part to their COVID response) – but on the other hand acknowledging that some in the community are emotionally flat (perhaps due in part to the impacts of COVID)...

### **Key Findings - Overview**



**Quality of Life** 

Overall, **97%** of residents stated that their quality of life is good, very good or excellent. Quality of life in the Willoughby LGA is on par with 2019 levels, and continues to be significantly higher than the Micromex Benchmark for other Metro NSW Councils.

**29%** believe quality of life has *improved* over the past few years (up from 24% in 2019), with this change being *significantly higher* among young people aged 16-34.

Based on a regression analysis, the *key drivers* of quality of life continue to be residents' perceived standard of living and satisfaction with their local area. When comparing 2021 scores to 2019 scores:

- Some attributes that are outside the individual, such as 'standard of living', 'your local area', and 'the home you live in' are relatively lower in importance.
- On the other hand, personal wellbeing and connectedness attributes such as 'your personal relationships', 'I generally do not feel lonely', 'I feel like my life has a sense of purpose' and 'your mental health' are relatively more important in driving overall quality of life ratings.



Recommending the Willoughby Area



Likelihood to recommend Willoughby as a place to **work** has seemingly softened, with 71% of residents likely or very likely to recommend the area, compared to 77% in 2019. However, when we focus on just those who are employed, the drop is less pronounced – 76% in 2019 versus 74% in 2021.



COVID-19

As noted on the previous slide, although quality of life has remained stable, COVID-19 appears to have had an impact of several aspects of personal and social wellbeing. Level of satisfaction with mental health has significantly decreased, and residents are more likely to feel lonely or anxious. Whilst it has generally been a difficult time for the community, residents have shown resilience. The statement 'I feel like I can adapt to change well' has the highest level of agreement among all personal wellbeing statements.

Not surprisingly, volunteering, level of involvement in social groups and political or civic actions have all decreased. There is also a sense that COVID-19 has contributed to difficulties accessing some services as mentioned by residents (unprompted).

One likely positive impact of COVID-19 is that residents are *significantly more likely* to walk to parks, ovals or bushland in their neighbourhood. Access to parks and open spaces continues to have a *high level of satisfaction*.

### **Healthy Lifestyles**


Residents express high levels of satisfaction with safety, and it is the fourth highest driver of auality of life.

- 91% of residents agree/strongly agree that it is a good thing for a society to be made up of people from different cultures and communities
- **84%** of residents agree/strongly agree that accepting immigrants from many different countries makes Willoughby stronger

# **Key Findings - Opportunities**




#### **Connection and Engagement**

**26%** of residents indicated that their <u>desired</u> level of connection and engagement is **higher than** their <u>current</u> level of connection and engagement. Overall, residents were more likely to say that there were fewer opportunities to have a say on issues important to them, as compared to 2019. Those who live in the West Ward were *significantly more likely* to suggest that they wanted to increase their level of engagement. Young people aged 16-34 were also more likely to say they wanted to be more connected/engaged (although not significantly).




#### **Mental Health**

Satisfaction with mental health has significantly decreased since 2019, which is likely to have been impacted by COVID-19 and the resulting lockdowns. Satisfaction with personal relationships, mental health and other personal wellbeing indicators such as 'I generally do not feel lonely' and 'I feel like my life has a sense of purpose' are key drivers of quality of life, and have increased in importance since 2019. Young people are less likely to be satisfied with their mental health, though not significantly. Singles/those living alone are less satisfied with personal relationships, less likely to feel like their life has a sense of purpose and experience positive emotions less frequently.



**3%** of residents ran out of food and were <u>unable</u> to afford more at least once in the past 12 months. This is *significantly higher* among young people aged 16-34, those who are renting, singles/living alone or in a group/shared household as well as those who identify as having a disability/long term illness or provide care.





As a direct result of housing costs, **22%** of residents had to unwillingly sacrifice spending on 'other things' (e.g. eating out, arts & cultural activities, sports & recreation). Residents who are renting are significantly more likely to have had to sacrifice spending. Single parents are *slightly more likely* to have sacrificed spending.

# **Key Findings - Opportunities**

#### **Physical Health**

**4%** of residents <u>do not</u> engage in 30 mins of physical activity at all in an average week. Residents aged 70+ have lower participation in physical activities and are *less satisfied* with access to public sports and recreation facilities as well as opportunities to participate in sporting and recreation activities.

Younger residents and those who speak a language other than English at home are *more likely* to have had fewer healthy days in the past 30 days.



#### **Diversity and Inclusion**

17% of residents agree/strongly agree that 'some groups who live in Willoughby are made not to feel welcome'. 12% agree/strongly agree that they 'feel like an outsider in their local neighbourhood'.

Females, carers and those who speak a language other than English are significantly more likely to agree that some groups are made not to feel welcome. Those who speak a language other than English are also significantly more likely to agree that they feel like an outsider.


**22%** of residents have seen or experienced discriminatory attitudes in the past 12 months. Young people and those who identify as having a disability or who provide ongoing care are more likely to have seen or experienced discriminatory attitudes.



#### **Social Involvement**

Volunteering, involvement in social groups and political/civic actions have all decreased since 2019, which has most likely been impacted by COVID-19. However, there are some groups who are less likely to be involved. Those who speak a language other than English at home are less likely to have participated in social group activities or political/civic actions.

15% of residents believe there are not any opportunities to have a say on local issues. This is significantly higher among residents who live in the Naremburn Ward. Young people and those who speak a language other than English are more likely to say there are fewer opportunities to have a say.



#### What has Changed Since 2019?

COVID-19 appears to have had an impact of mental health and personal wellbeing. Mean satisfaction with 'your mental health' has significantly decreased.

Agreement with the following personal wellbeing statements is significantly lower...

### Summary – Acceptance of People and Cultures



### Negative Statements - What has Changed Since 2019?

Residents are **slightly more likely to disagree** with the following statements...

- I feel like an outsider in my local neighbourhood community
- There is a lot of disagreement between people in the Willoughby community

Whilst there appears to be a positive shift in attitudes towards acceptance of people and cultures (higher levels of agreement of positive statements shown on the left), there is still room for improvement in terms of making everyone feel welcome. 17% of all respondents agree/strongly agree that 'some groups who live in Willoughby are made not to feel welcome'.

Females, carers and those who speak a language other than English are significantly more likely to agree with this statement.

### Summary – Local Area

#### **Level of Engagement**



**26%** of residents indicated that they would like to be more engaged than they currently are.

This is significantly higher among residents who live in the West Ward.

#### **Asking for Help**

**93%** of residents <u>could</u> ask for help from neighbours or local friends.

Friends and family were the main support groups.



#### **Providing Help**

**83%** of residents <u>provided help</u> to neighbours or local friends.

Residents were significantly more likely to say they provided help shopping and slightly more likely to say they provided emotional support or provided food or money in an emergency (compared to 2019).



75% of residents have provided unpaid volunteer support to one or more types of organisations in the past 12 months, down from 61% in 2019.

This has likely been impacted by restrictions in physically being able to meet due to COVID-19.

7% of residents <u>could not</u> ask for help from neighbours or local friends

Groups **significantly more likely** to state they are <u>unable</u> to ask for help:

# Summary – Local Area (continued)



#### **Your Local Area**

**42%** of residents associate their 'local area' with the suburb that they live in.

Residents are significantly more likely to consider the Council area that they live in as their 'local area', and less likely to consider the Northern Suburbs as their 'local area' compared to 2019.

Overall, level of agreement has slightly increased for 6 of the 12 statements about the local Willoughby area, as compared to 2019.

Residents that consider their local area to be in close proximity, i.e. the street they live in or the streets immediately surrounding their home were generally less likely to agree with all statements, significantly so for 6 of them.

Conversely, those who consider their local area to be the suburb or postcode they live in were significantly more likely to agree with statements about being proud about where they live, trust and community spirit.







**Accessing Services** 



of residents say they have difficulty accessing one or more types of services (see below-left for main services selected by respondents)\*\*

(compared to 24% in 2019)

The majority of residents have access to non-car transport options they could use to get to various locations such as: accessing government services, getting to work, going out for recreation, arocery shopping etc.

However, up to 10% of residents do not have access to alternative transport options for going to an education facility to take a child to school or childcare.

### Services that are Most Difficult to Access

- Public transport (11%)
- Government Services (8%)
- Gaming, coding, programming or other ITrelated events and activities (5%)

### Main Reasons for Services and Activities Being Difficult to Access

- Lack of transport options
- No service in your area
- Poor customer service
- · Remote location/hard to get to
- · Lack of time
- They are not open at the times I require

#### Differences by demographics:

- Residents aged 70 years or older and residents who live in the Sailors Bay Ward are significantly more likely to say it is difficult to access one or more service.
- Those who identify as having a disability/longterm illness, provide care or are a couple with children are significantly more likely to say they have difficulty accessing Government services.
- Difficulty accessing public transport is also significantly more likely to be mentioned by those with a disability/long-term illness.



Residents are significantly more likely to walk to green spaces such as parks, ovals or bushland as compared to 2019, potentially a positive impact of COVID lockdowns.




Compared to 2019, there has been a *significant decrease* in those who said they <u>never</u> experience negative emotions and a *significant increase* in those who said they <u>sometimes</u> experience negative emotions.

Residents born in Australia, do not speak a language other than English, rent or work (either full-time or part-time) are slightly more likely to have experienced negative emotions.

# **Summary – Social and Community Engagement**

#### **Involvement in Social Groups**

No involvement



of residents said they had **no** involvement in social groups in the past 12 months, a significant increase from 20% in 2019.

This is likely due to the impact of COVID-19 and resulting lockdowns.

Sport or physical recreation groups, special interest or hobby groups, social groups through school/TAFE/University, religious/spiritual groups and ethnic/multicultural groups have all been impacted.

Groups significantly more likely to state they were not involved in any social groups:

- Speak a language other than English
- Live in an apartment/flat
- Single parents
- Unemployed

Those who had access to a car were significantly more likely to be involved in activities organized by social groups.


### **Political and Civic Actions**

Overall, 55% of residents participated in a political or civic action in the past 12 months. The most common actions were signing a petition, being a member of a group that makes decisions or writing/speaking to a Federal or State Member of Parliament.

Participation in the following political and civic actions significantly decreased since 2019:

- Signing a petition
- Participating in an online discussion about political or local community issues
- Participating in a community consultation or attending a public Council meeting

#### Opportunities to Have a Say



Residents are significantly less likely to commit to saying that they definitely have enough opportunities to have a say on important issues, and are more likely to say 'sometimes' compared to 2019. Belief that there are adequate opportunities to have a say increase with age.





Overall, 97% of residents in the Willoughby area say their quality of life is good to excellent.

Quality of life is on par with 2019 levels and continues to be significantly higher than the Micromex Metro benchmark. Sailors Bay residents rated their quality of life significantly higher compared to other wards – although results for all Wards are favourable.



Those who identified as having a disability or long-term illness have a significantly lower quality of life, as was the case in 2019 – although their rating of 4.91 is almost identical to our overall metropolitan norm of 4.90 reported on Slide 23. Getting enough sleep also continues to be associated with having a higher quality of life.

Overall, residents were slightly more likely to say that quality of life within the Willoughby LGA has improved over the past few years (29% in 2021 vs 24% in 2019, not statistically significant at the 95% confidence level). Younger residents, and those who rated their own quality of life as 'excellent' were significantly more likely to say that general quality of life has improved in the LGA, whilst residents aged 50+ were significantly less likely.



Residents expressed high levels of satisfaction with safety, access to parks and open spaces and their standard of living. Satisfaction with mental health is the only attribute to have significantly decreased since 2019, which may have been impacted by COVID-19 and associated lockdowns.





In 2019, 5% of our sample were unemployed – this year it is down marginally to 3%, perhaps reflecting lower unemployment rates across Australia. This may explain the small (and not significant) increase in the mean rating for 'I have good job security'.

In contrast, there has been a slight decrease this year in the mean score for 'My work and family life do not interfere with each other' – we could have perhaps expected the reverse as more people were working from home due to COVID...<sup>30</sup>

### COVID-19 appears to have had an impact on personal wellbeing to some extent:

- The statement 'I feel like I can adapt to change well' has the highest level of agreement of all statements in 2021 (and virtually identical to 2019), which is encouraging.
- However, residents have significantly lower levels of agreement with 'I generally do not feel lonely' and 'I generally
  do not feel anxious' compared to 2019 which is consistent with the earlier 'mental health' rating (Slide 28).

Agreement with the statement 'I feel like I can adapt to change well' is slightly higher among residents aged 16-34 and significantly lower among residents aged 70 or older. Younger residents are also more likely to agree with feeling valued and appreciated and being confident in achieving the things they want in life. However, they also have the lowest mean score for 'I generally do not feel anxious'. Females have lower levels of agreement with the statements 'I feel like I have a balance between work and life' and 'I generally do not feel anxious'.

### **Regression Analysis**

Another lens through which to consider the 15 Quality of Life attributes and the 7 Personal Wellbeing attributes is via Micromex's Regression analysis...

#### Why is Regression Analysis Needed?

Knowing the extent to which the community is satisfied/dissatisfied or agrees/disagrees with a series of 'life' statements (previous slides) is of course useful – however, the scores do not necessarily identify which of the attributes are having most impact on overall quality of life.

A Regression analysis however allows us to specifically identify how Willoughby Council can actively drive overall quality of life.

Regression analysis is a statistical tool for investigating relationships between independent variables (in this case, the 15 Quality of Life attributes and the 7 Personal Wellbeing attributes) and a dependent variable (in this case, overall quality of life).

#### What does it tell us?

The chart on the following page summarises the Regression Value for all 22 attributes:


- The sum of the scores for all 22 attributes is 100%. The higher the score, the more variance in quality of life is explained by that variable. Thus, any improvements Council can make in the higher scoring areas has the potential to improve overall quality of life ratings.
- Based on the 22 attributes from the survey (there may of course be other important drivers that were not included in the survey), a
  large driver of quality of life is how satisfied residents are with their standard of living, followed by satisfaction with their local area –
  these two attributes dominated in 2019 as well.
- Compared to 2019, satisfaction/agreement with personal relationships, mental health and other personal wellbeing indicators such as 'I generally do not feel lonely' and 'I feel like my life has a sense of purpose' have increased in importance.
- The top 10 drivers are highlighted in dark blue over the next two slides. These key drivers (45% of the 22 attributes) account for nearly 70% of the variation in quality of life. So whilst all 22 statements are important, these top 10 statements are relatively more important and potentially significant drivers of quality of life.

Dependent variable: Thinking about your life and personal circumstances, overall, how would you rate the quality of life you have living in the Willoughby Local Government Area? (Q2a)



### Derived Importance Scores (%)




# Mapping Stated Satisfaction/Agreement and Derived Importance













Older residents (50+) tend to have a more micro view of their local area (their street and surrounding streets), whilst younger residents (16-34) are slightly more likely to consider their Council area or Norther Suburbs as their local area. Naremburn residents are also significantly more likely to view the Council area they live in or the Northern Suburbs as their local area.



All but one statements have high levels of agreement (greater than 1.00 mean score). Perceptions of resilience have increased, as evidenced by significantly higher agreement with the statement 'my local community copes well when faced with challenges' compared to 2019. 





























Blending the two 'emotions' questions together, we can see that 2% of residents stated that they rarely/never experience positive emotions but often/sometimes experience negative emotions (so an atrisk group). This is identical to the 2019 result, which is encouraging given the increase in negative emotions noted on Slide 91 (in other words, whilst there has been an increase in negative emotions in 2021, it amongst those who also experience positive emotions 'often' / 'sometimes').



# **Potentially Vulnerable Groups**

Examining results across different demographics allows us to identify potentially vulnerable members of the community, and pinpoint the specific areas in which increased attention/resources may need to be allocated.

#### Single/Living alone

Those who are single/living alone reported a significantly lower quality of life. They are more likely to:

- Be dissatisfied with personal relationships, physical health, access to parks and open spaces, and access to public sports and recreation facilities
- Disagree that they feel safe walking alone in their local area during the day
- Feel lonely, feel like their life does not have purpose and have less confidence that they can achieve the things they want in life
- Have experienced positive emotions less frequently
- Not have access to a car
- · Have experienced food shortages
- Be unable to access or raise \$2,000 within two days in an emergency
- Be unable to ask neighbours or local friends for help
- Disagree that their local neighbourhood is a great place to live and that they feel proud to live in the Willoughby community
- Disagree that their local community copes well when faced with challenges

#### Single Parents with children at home

Single parents are significantly more likely to be dissatisfied with their standard of living. They are more likely to:

- Be dissatisfied with access to public sports and recreational facilities
- Have had to sacrifice spending on other things as a direct result of housing costs
- Say there are fewer opportunities to have a say on important issues
- Consider moving out of the Willoughby area in the next 5 years

The differences highlighted for each of the vulnerable groups are either significant differences or smaller differences that are not significant but, when viewed within the context of other findings, suggest a theme or trend may be evident.

# **Potentially Vulnerable Groups**

#### Younger residents

Younger residents reported greater levels of stress and mental health concerns, with a feeling of disconnect from the community. They are more likely to:

#### Stress/mental health

- Not be satisfied with their mental health
- Feel anxious
- · Have had fewer healthy days
- Say that fresh fruit and vegetables are not readily available in their area
- Have run out of food and not been able to afford more
- Have had to sacrifice spending on other things due to housing costs

#### Community

- Not feel part of their local neighbourhood community
- Want to increase their connection/engagement to the local area
- Not have participated in social group activities or political/civic actions
- Have seen or experienced discriminatory behaviour

#### Older residents

Older residents are more likely to feel unsafe both at home and in their local area, experience difficulties accessing services and are less likely to agree that they can adapt to change well. They also reported lower participation in physical activities, but commented on how this was linked to a lack of access. They are more likely to:

#### Safety

- Not feel safe in public places in the Willoughby area
- Not feel safe at home at night
- Not feel safe walking alone in the local area during the day
- Not feel safe walking alone in the local area at night

#### **Physical activities**

- Not be satisfied with their physical health (although they report on average more healthy days!) and access to public sports and recreation facilities/opportunities to participate in sport and recreation activities
- Not have access to a car

The differences highlighted for each of the vulnerable groups are either significant differences or smaller differences that are not significant but, when viewed within the context of other findings, suggest a theme or trend may be evident.

## **Potentially Vulnerable Groups**

#### Speak a language other than English at home

Residents that speak a language other than English at home are more dissatisfied with their standard of living and the home they live in. They are more likely to:

- Be dissatisfied with personal relationships
- Agree that some groups who live in Willoughby are made not to feel welcome and that they feel like an outsider in their local community
- Have experienced positive emotions less frequently
- Want to increase their connection/engagement with the local area
- Not walk around their local area/neighbourhood and have had fewer healthy days
- Less likely to have participated in social group activities or political/civic actions
- Believe that there are less opportunities to have a say on important issues

#### Have a long-term illness or disability

Residents who identify as having a disability or long-term illness report having a significantly lower quality of life. They are more likely to:

- Be dissatisfied with statements about the local area, including: standard of living, safety, personal relationships, mental health, physical health, what they are currently achieving in life, future security, and access to parks and open spaces
- · Feel lonely or anxious
- Not feel valued or appreciated by others, able to adapt to change well and feel confident they can achieve the things they want in life
- · Have seen or experienced discriminatory attitudes
- · Have run out of food and not been able to afford more
- · Want to increase their connection/engagement with the local area
- Have difficulties accessing services e.g. public transport, government services, disability support services
- Not have access to a car/mention lack of transport options as a reason for having difficulties accessing services

# **Background & Methodology**

#### Sample selection and error

A total of 671 resident interviews were completed. 568 of the 671 respondents were chosen by means of a computer based random selection process using SamplePages, Australian Marketing Lists, List Brokers and the electronic White Pages. 92 respondents were recruited via the Micromex Community Panel. The remaining 11 respondents were 'number harvested' via face-to-face intercept at several locations around the Willoughby LGA. Note: due to the COVID lockdown in NSW, no new number harvesting was conducted in 2021, though previously collected numbers were used.

A sample size of 671 residents provides a maximum sampling error of plus or minus 3.8% at 95% confidence. This means that if the survey was replicated with a new universe of N=671 residents, 19 times out of 20 we would expect to see the same results, i.e. +/- 3.8%. So for example, an answer such as 'yes' (50%) to a question could vary from 46% to 54%.

The sample was weighted by age, gender and ward to reflect the 2016 ABS Census data for Willoughby City Council.

#### Interviewing

Interviewing was conducted in accordance with The Research Society Code of Professional Behaviour.

#### **Prequalification**

Participants in this survey were pre-qualified as being over the age of 16, living in the Willoughby LGA, and not working for, nor having an immediate family member working for, Willoughby City Council.

# **Background & Methodology**

#### Data analysis

The data within this report was analysed using Q Professional.

Within the report, ▲ ▼ are used to identify statistically significant differences between groups, i.e., gender, age, ratepayer status, residential location and length of time lived in the LGA.

Significance difference testing is a statistical test performed to evaluate the difference between two measurements. To identify the statistically significant differences between the groups of means, 'One-Way Anova tests' and 'Independent Samples T-tests' were used. 'Z Tests' were also used to determine statistically significant differences between column percentages.

#### **Percentages**

All percentages are calculated to the nearest whole number and therefore the total may not exactly equal 100%.

#### Micromex LGA Benchmark

Micromex has developed Community Satisfaction Benchmarks using normative data from over 60 unique councils, more than 130 surveys and over 75,000 interviews since 2012.
